- Do not attempt to compromise the security or operation of the site.

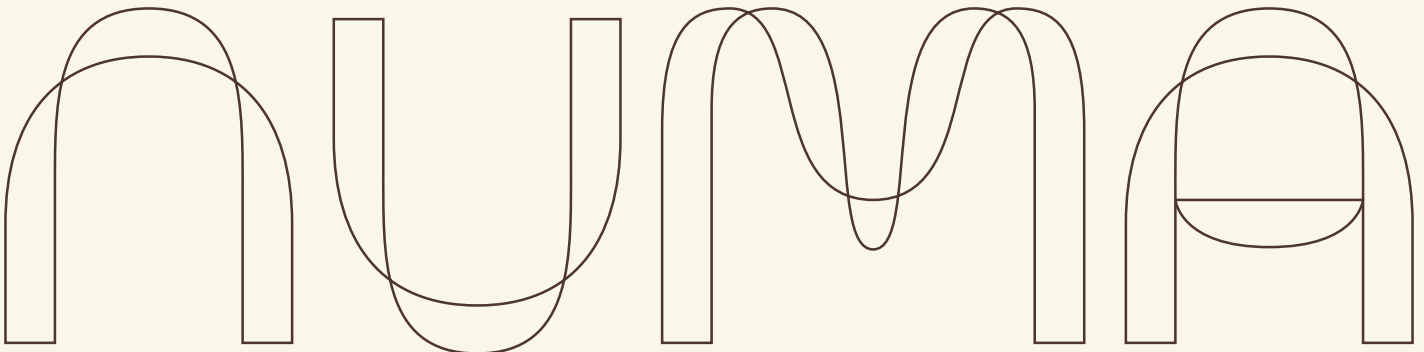
